Daily Reading

Maths

This half term, our maths learning includes number, place value, addition, subtraction, measurements, multiplication and division.

Maths around Me: Take a maths walk around your home, garden or local area. Find 10 examples of maths in real life . You could spot numbers, shapes, measurements, prices, times, patterns or signs. Record what you find.	Number Line Challenge: Draw a number line from 0–100 . Choose 10 numbers and mark where you think they belong. Can you explain how you know where each number should go?	Times Tables Hunt: Choose a times table you are practising (3s and 10s). Find 10 objects around your home and make equal groups. Write the multiplication sentences to match your groups. For example: 4 groups of 3 = 4 × 3 = 12.	Maths in the Kitchen: Help with some cooking or baking! Find examples of maths while you are preparing food. Look for weighing, measuring, fractions, time and temperature . Record at least 3 pieces of maths you used.
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Times tables

Regular times table practice is essential. This can be done using Times Table Rock Stars, Hit the button, writing them out or simply through call and response. <https://play.ttrockstars.com>

It is expected that children will be confident in all their tables up to 12 x 12 by the end of **Year 4**.
