A big part of our pantry is keeping our customer's dignity, our set up is similar to a regular store and each customer pays £5 per shop.

For their £5 we offer a choice of fruit, veg, tinned foods, cereals, butter, cheese, milk, sauces, shampoo, toothpaste, baby milk, nappies, frozen meats and more- depending on what donations we receive.

Unfortunately, we are currently struggling to keep up with the demand of these essential products that our service users need to help feed and support their families.
